The math Department in primary and secondary engaged the students in many activities to make them entertained. Presentations were given for parents orientation to explain well about our curriculum and rules and regulations of the school. Mental math programme has started for primary level. New innovative ideas have been shared with teachers every week ,with the support of our SLT team our journey is going smoothly forward to approach and attain great success.

MATHEMATICS

Mathematics is the science and study of quality, structure, space, and change. Mathematicians seek out patterns, formulate new conjectures, and establish truth by rigorous deduction from appropriately chosen axioms and definitions. Number Properties area focuses on students' abilities to represent numbers, order numbers, compute with numbers, make estimates appropriate to given situations, use ratios and proportional reasoning, and apply number properties and operations to solve real-world and mathematical problems. Measurement area focuses on students' understanding of measurement attributes such as capacity, weight/mass, time, and temperature as well as the geometric attributes of length, area, and volume. Students may be asked to select appropriate units and tools for measuring, to measure length with a ruler at all three grades, to measure angles with a protractor at grades 8 and 12, and to solve application problems related to units of measurement. Geometry area focuses on identification of geometric shapes and transformations and combinations of those shapes. By grade 4, students are expected to be familiar with simple plane figures such as lines, circles, triangles, and rectangles as well as solid figures such as cubes, spheres, and cylinders. The Probability area focuses on students' skills in four areas: data representation, characteristics of data sets, experiments and samples, and probability.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

SCHOOL UNIFORM

It is mandatory for students to come to school in proper uniform. P.E uniforms must be worn only on P.E days. Year 10 to 13 students can wear the P.E uniform only this academic year. Colourful jackets, track pants, colored shoes and casual clothing is strictly not allowed. Black and white shoes to be worn as applicable.

JEWELLERY AND MAKE UP

Fancy or any kind of make up is strictly not allowed. Girls can wear a small stud on their ears. No bangles, long earrings, necklaces, or rings to be worn. Applying Lip glosses and nail paints too are not allowed in school.

TIMINGS

Punctuality is crucial in developing child's holistic character. The school gates open at 7:00 am and class Assemblies, Attendance is marked during the form time which is up to 7:30 am. Classes according to the time table begin at 7:30 am. Please ensure thta your child reaches school on time and avoid being late.

Afternoon pick up timings are at 2:30 pm onwards. Parents are advised to pick up the child on time and inform the concern person in advance if there is any delay in picking up their child, this is very important as part of safety and well-being of our students.

AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

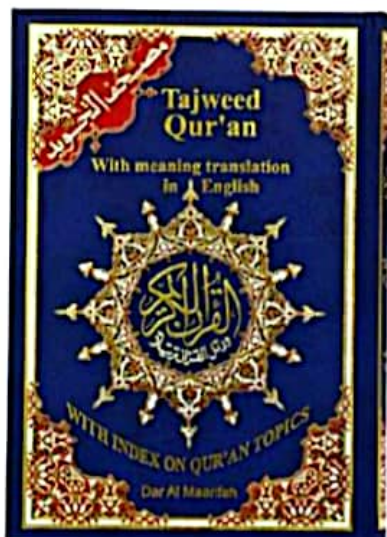
