





These scores will serve as an important diagnostic tool, providing valuable feedback on individual performance and highlighting specific areas of strength and topics where further attention may be needed. IBT TEST (International Benchmark Tests)

The IBT exams were conducted in the Ministry Section from November 3 to 4 for students in grades 7, 8, 9, and 10 in the subjects of Mathematics, Arabic, English, and Science. The IBT aims to assess students' performance according to internationally standardized criteria and determine each student's level compared to peers globally. These tests also seek to identify strengths and areas for improvement and support schools in enhancing the quality of education by providing accurate reports that help improve educational plans. Furthermore, these exams contribute to tracking students' progress annually and prepare them for major international assessments, providing detailed reports that show the student's performance relative to the school and international averages.





HUMANITIES PROJECT - HISTORY LINKED TO MATH (Yr 7, 8, &9)






Inside the Lab: Last day of Robotics - Entrepreneurship









أسبوع العلوم من 10-نوفمبر إلى 13 نوفمبر




